As regards the 2030 Agenda, UN-Women supports in particular the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 5, on achieving gender equality and empowering all women and airls, as well as of the aender dimensions of all the other Goals, through gender mainstreaming, recognizing that gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls are essential to the achievement of sustainable development in all its dimensions

"The United Nations defines violence against women as "any act of genderbased violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual, or mental harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life"

The successful interventions are those that prioritize safety of women; whose core elements involve challenging unequal aender power relationships; that are participatory: address multiple risk factors through combined programming and that start early in the life course.

To achieve lasting change, it is important to enact and enforce legislation and develop and implement policies that promote gender equality; allocate resources to prevention and response; and invest in women's rights organizations

"Women's rights are the fundamental human rights that were enshrined by the United Nations for every human being on the planet nearly 70 years ago. These rights include the right to live free from violence, slavery, and discrimination; to be educated; to own property; to vote; and to earn a fair and equal wage."

As the now-famous saving goes, "women's rights are human rights." That is to say, women are entitled to all of these rights. Yet almost everywhere around the world, women and airls are still denied them, often simply because of their gender.



alone but the whole family unit. Despite considerable social changes, women continue to be the focus of family life. The impact of breast cancer is therefore profound on both the woman diagnosed with the disease and her family. Their fear and anxiety over the eventual outcome of the illness may manifest itself through behavioural changes."

Breast cancer is a heterogeneous disease in both its bioloay and clinical manifestations. Advances in knowledge and progress in the therapy of breast cancer have been based upon a multidisciplinary approach, which is required for the development of early detection and screening guidelines as well as the proper treatment and follow-up of patients. A standardized protocol requires a systematic review of the literature to address the core questions of who is to benefit from the health intervention, i.e. those at high risk of early morbidity and mortality, and what health intervention is most appropriate in terms of efficacy and has been proven to be cost-effective in reducing morbidity and mortality.

The HHS Office on Women's Health (OWH) leads this awareness day, partnering with the HIV community to spread the word about HIV prevention, care, and treatment for women and girls. "Together, we can strive to end cervical cancer within a few aenerations."

When diagnosed, cervical cancer is one of the most successfully treatable forms of cancer, as long as it is detected early and managed effectively. Cancers diagnosed in late stages can also be controlled with appropriate treatment and palliative care. With a comprehensive approach to prevent, screen and treat, we can end cervical cancer as a public health problem within a few generations.

"Proponents call it the Second Feminist Wave, the first having ebbed after the glorious victory of suffrage and disappeared, finally, into the sandbar of Togetherness."

The wave metaphor caught on: It became a useful way of linking the women's movement of the '60s and '70s to the women's movement of the suffragettes, and to suggest that the women's libbers weren't a bizarre historical aberration, as their detractors sneered, but a new chapter in a grand history of women fighting together for their rights. Over time, the wave metaphor became a way to describe and distinguish between different eras and generations of feminism.



Child Marriage and the discrimination of the girl child

"Child and forced marriage is a human rights violation and a harmful practice that disproportionately affects women and girls globally, preventing them from living their lives free from all forms of violence."

Worldwide, more than 650 million women alive today were married as children. Every year, at least 12 million girls are married before they reach the age of 18. This is 28 girls every minute. One in every five girls is married, or in union, before reaching age 18. In the least developed countries, that number doubles: 40 per cent of girls are married before age 18, and 12 per cent of girls are married before age 15. The practice is particularly widespread in conflict-affected countries and humanitarian settings



Women in Science & Technology for Development

"Too many of the breakthrough contributions of women in science, technology, engineering, and math fields continue to go untold, too often fading into obscurity. Let's write them back into history."

Women were central in the early teams building the foundation of modern programming. They unveiled the structure of DNA. Their work inspired new environmental movements and led to the discovery of new genes.
